The Hall now stands to provide recognition and inspiration to sailing enthusiasts. Here are a few of the comments made during the ceremony at San Diego Yacht Club on October 23, 2011:

Paul Cayard, 2011 NSHOF inductee:

"I would like to acknowledge my father who is with me today, and who built

the <u>El Toro</u> that is on display. That was my very first boat that he built in our garage in San Francisco in 1968. Fate is an interesting thing. My parents didn't sail, and we had no sailing in our family. It was when I was in school, and a second grade classmate's family sailed and they invited me to a small lake in Oakland called Lake Merritt.

"I went sailing there a couple times, and my dad could see that I was passionate about sailing. I was just eight years old, and he probably thought that this was just another fad that would pass. But he went ahead and built me a boat in the winter one year, and that was the beginning. Obviously we all here have a lot of sailing talent, we are born with it, it's in our blood, but what if we never had the opportunity to realize it? (Thankfully) life and fate took care of that."
